GOSPEL REFLECTION

The Gospel next week is linked to last Sunday's about the two sons sent to work in their father's vineyard. One promised to go and work there but he did not actually go. The other at first refused but later relented and went. The message clearly is that God's people have been poor tenants in the Lord's vineyard. However, we read this not to sit in judgement on certain people in the past. We must be careful to be aware of the relevance of this parable for our own situation. We are not reading it for historical reasons but for reflection on our own lives and behaviour.



Today, we are God's people. We are the tenants in the vineyard. Now he expects us to produce fruit, fruit that will endure. The obvious question for us to ask ourselves today is: How are we doing? How much better are we than the chief priests, the elders, the Scribes and the Pharisees? We are specially privileged, by Baptism, to be called to work in the Lord's vineyard. Each week we are invited to gather together to hear the Gospel message and to make it part of our lives. We are all called to be members, active members of the Body of Christ, the Christian community, the Church.

READING WITH CHILDREN Step 1– SHARING BOOKS WITH YOUNG ONES

There are lots of children's books and many of them are written in English language. You don't have to speak English well to share books with children. Reading books is more than just reading the words on a page.

STEP 2: FINDING ALL THE PARTS OF A BOOK

There are many ways of reading books. Tell your child about the book. It has a front cover, a spine, pages, words and pictures and it has a back cover. Inside the front cover, it has a title page with the name or title of the book.
