The Good The Bad The Ugly.

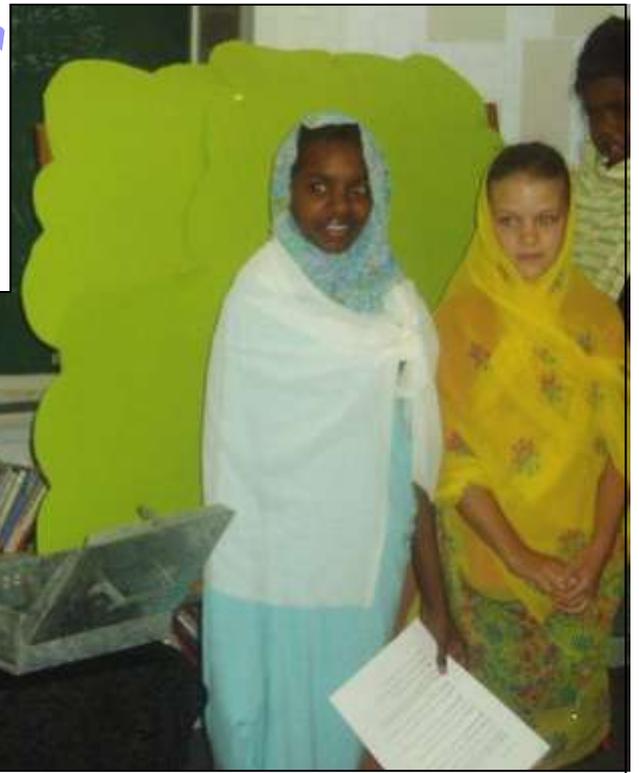
