

WHAT'S THE SCOOP WITH THE SENOIR PRIMARY GROUP?


Welcome back to Term 3 everyone.

This week in Science Mr Steve taught the Senior Primary class about magnets and magnetic force. We learnt that a magnet is an object or material, usually metallic, which produces an invisible force called a magnetic field. The force allows it to attract some metals and to attract or repel other magnets from a distance. It was a fun lesson where we all got to experiment with magnets and magnetic fields. We all got to take 2 magnets home to do our own experiments. We are excited to see what Mr Steve will teach us next week.

Both the Cobra & Black Head Snake groups began new reading programs this week. The Cobras are learning about Geese migration and the Black Head Snakes are learning about living things through their reading stories.
