We have been learning about our home in Geography. We built what we think our home looks like. We built windows, doors, a roof and some of us built a camp.




NEWS FROM MIDDLE PRIMARY



As part of their recently awarded NDRP grant, the WA Council of Social Service will be travelling to the Kimberley and the Pilbara delivering training to assist community organisations in building their resilience in responding to and recovering from natural disasters.

The one-day workshops will be facilitated by WACOSS Manager Projects and Business Development, Stuart Reid. Can you please contact Stuart to discuss local arrangements for delivery of the workshops in Broome, Fitzroy, Kununurra, Karratha, Newman and Hedland.

Workshops are planned for the first three weeks in September but at this stage, the only date locked in is for Broome on 4 September.

The training is in the use of an online resource developed by the Australian Council of Social Service which allows organisations to benchmark their current capacities and resilience, identify areas for improvement and then works through a 'Six Steps to Resilience' tool.

The project is supported by a Natural Disasters Resilience Program Grant so there will be minimal cost to participants. WACOSS is proposing to charge \$25 per participant to offset local costs and ensure buy-in from potential participating organisations. Stuart has indicated that local governments are welcome to participate.

Any assistance you can provide to Stuart in getting the message out to your networks in the community sector would be greatly appreciated.




